Let us declare our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

**We believe in one God,

On the night before he died,

Gave thanks, and shared it with his disciples
saying:
'This is my blood poured out for you and for
many, for the forgiveness of sins'.

So Father, with this bread and this cup
we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life.
As you feed us with these gifts,
send your Holy Spirit, and change us more and
more to be like Jesus our Saviour.

Help us Father to love one another,
as we look forward to that day
when suffering is ended,
and all creation is gathered in your loving arms.
And now with all your saints we give you
glory,
through Jesus Christ, in the strength of the
Spirit, today and for ever. **Amen.**
