## **We listen to God's Word**

## **Giving of Communion**

*You will then be invited forward. We welcome all those who are baptised and who love and follow the Lord Jesus to share in the bread and wine.*

*At Communion, we are invited to feed on Christ in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving, so if we opt to abstain from the wine and receive the bread alone we still obtain the full spiritual benefit of the sacrament. If you are at all uncomfortable with sharing the Common Cup, then, please do not feel under any pressure.*

*If you do not wish to receive the bread and wine, you are welcome to come forward to receive a prayer of blessing. Please keep your hands by your side to indicate this to the minister.*

With your whole Church throughout the world  
we offer you this sacrifice of praise  
and lift our voice to join the eternal song of heaven:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,  
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.**

The Lord's Prayer

**As our Saviour taught us so we pray:

## We Celebrate Holy Communion

The Lord is here.
