Draw near with faith.

Receive the body of our lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which is shed for you.

Eat and drink in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

As we come to receive these holy gifts, we pray together:

**Most merciful Lord, your love compels us to come in.
Our hands were unclean, our hearts were unprepared;
we were not fit
even to eat the crumbs from under your table.
But you, Lord, are the God of our salvation,
and share your bread with sinners.
So cleanse and feed us
with the precious body and blood of your Son,
that he may live in us and we in him;
and that we, with the whole company of Christ,
may sit and eat in your kingdom. Amen.**

Giving of Communion

You will then be invited forward. We welcome all those who are baptised and who love and follow the Lord Jesus to share in the bread and wine.

At Communion, we are invited to feed on Christ in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving, so if we opt to abstain from the wine and receive the bread alone we still obtain the full spiritual benefit of the sacrament. If you are at all uncomfortable with sharing the Common Cup, then, please do not feel under any pressure.

If you do not wish to receive the bread and wine, you are welcome to come forward to receive a prayer of blessing. Please keep your hands by your side to indicate this to the minister.

**On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory
to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.
We believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and
glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

As you feed us with these gifts,

send your Holy Spirit,

and change us more and more to be like Jesus our Saviour.

Help us Father to love one another,

as we look forward to that day when suffering is ended, and all creation is gathered in your loving arms.

And now with all your saints we give you glory,

through Jesus Christ, in the strength of the Spirit,

today and for ever. **Amen.**
